It was particularly fascinating for me as I'd been to each place mentioned in the play.

II I was to have stayed for Sirini's big 60th birthday party but I had such a cold I came home and have been mostly in bed for a week. I'm finally better but haven't much energy. You are really remarkable in all you do and I hope your Zurich doctor will be pleased with you.


