COMMITTEES OF THE CONGRESS:

The XXIInd International Congress of Orientalists will be held under the patronage of the President of the Turkish Republic, H. E. Celal Bayar, in the premises of the Faculties of Law and Economics of the University of Istanbul, from September 15th to

A Committee of Patronage has been set up consisting of the following personalities: the Prime Minister of the Turkish Republic, the Minister of Foreign Affairs, the Minister of Public Instruction, the Rectors of the University and the Technical University of Istanbul, the Rector of the University of Ankara, the Governor and Mayor of Istanbul.

Further an Honorary Committee and, to assist the Organizing Committee, an Advisory Committee have been elected. The names of the members of these two committees, as well as those of the members of the subcommittees for accommodation. exhibitions, excursions and scientific questions, which have been attached to the Organizing Committee, will be published in the third circular.

ACTIVITIES OF THE CONGRESS:

The sections which the Congress will comprise 2) and the specialists who will direct these sections, have been determined through an inquiry among scholars of the respective sections in different countries. Particulars about the sections, subsections and about the heads and secretaries of these will be given in our next circular. According to information so far received, the Congress will have a large attendance. Besides the scholars who were present at the International Congress of Orientalists in Paris, we expect at our Congress members from Germany and from the new states of Israel, Pakistan, India and Indonesia.

Owing to the large number of contributions, the sections will be divided into subsections. For such separate fields as philology, ethnography, archaeology, prehistory, and

As the convening of two large Congresses at the same time raises complications with regard to the questions of accommodation and sightseeing, we were obliged to learn the definitive date of the Interparliamentary Congress before finally fixing the date of our Congress. The date of the Interparliamentary Congress (1 - 9 September) was communicated to our government only the lat April. We were thus obliged to change the date of our Congress (which had been provisionally fixed for the 8-15 September) to the 15-22 September.

history, it will be necessary to form subsections without overlapping. For example, in case of need the section "Ancient Orienta," would comprise as subsections Ancient Oriental Archaeology and Ancient Oriental Philology; the section "Islamic Studies," the subsections Moslem Religion, Law and Sociology of the Islamic peoples, common aspects of political, cultural and economic History in Islamic countries, as well as the historical geography of these countries; the section "Far East," the subsections China, Japan, Indonesia and Malaya; the section "Central Asia," the subsection of Caucasian Languages. In view of suggestions, the "Turcology," section has been labelled "Section of Turcology and Ural-Altaic languages,". This section, besides comprising Turkish philology and history, may have separate branches for Ural-Altaic languages. In the section "Islamic Art," such subjects as general Islamic, Arabian, Turkish, Iranian, and Moslem-Indian arts and music will be divided into subsections if this appears necessary. In order to avoid overlapping among various sections, and in order that joint sessions of the kindred sections on common subjects may be organized in due time, the summaries of the contributions should be sent in not later than the middle of July 1951.

In view of the fact that, owing to the advance of Oriental Studies, Orientalistics is no longer confined to philology, but extends to studies in the culture and cultural history of the oriental countries, we recommend that the communications should deal in every field with the general problems of Oriental Studies rather than the specific, and should concentrate on such topics as method and the relationships between different disciplines connected with oriental studies. This point has been emphasized at the express desire of scholars who participated in the preceding International Congresses of Orientalists.

The contributions read in the plenary sessions are limited to 40 minutes, the papers read at the meetings of the sections to 20 minutes, discussions not included.

If the number of subsections is increased, the time-limit may be prolonged. If in the sections without any subsections a great number of papers are to be read, the heads of the sections would naturally be entitled to reduce the duration of the lectures to 15 minutes.

No matter how long the text of the communication may be, the actual reading of the abstract ought not to take more than 15 or 20 minutes. The papers may be read and the discussions may take place either in French, English or German. In the sections where the majority of members understand Turkish, this language may be used.

If there is sufficient time, the communications of members who cannot personally

attend the Congress can be read with approval of the sectional heads.

For the communications with projections special halls have been reserved. Our slides measure $8 \text{ cm} \times 8 \text{ cm}$, $10 \text{ cm} \times 10 \text{ cm}$. Apparatus for microfilm projections are also at the disposal of the lecturers. The size of the diapositives should conform to these measures. Those who intend to make projections are requested to inform the secretarial office.

MEMBERSHIP:

For the members of the Congress the participation fee is 15 T.L.; accompanying persons are charged 10 T.L. each. This sum should be paid to the Registrar of the Organizing Committee after arrival in Istanbul or sent in advance the membership-card will be filled out here and sent to the Turkish Consulates in .The respective towns, where the members will apply for their visa. It is therefore requisite that the members indicate this point on the Application, attached to this circular.

With his membership-card a member is entitled to take advantage of the reductions in boats and railways fares as well as of the accommodation facilities; he has also the right to attend the exhibitions and performances.

All money-orders to the Congress should be sent to Nr. 2046 in the Central Bank of the Turkish Republic in Istanbul.

TRAVELLING FACILITIES:

Participants coming from Europe can make use of Turkish boats from Marseilles, Genoa, and Naples, those coming from the East can board Turkish boats at Alexandria, Haifa and Beyrouth.

¹⁾ Members wishing to attend the Assumption Mass at Ephesus on August 15th, can errive in time by taking Turkish ships leaving Marseilles on July 31st, Genoa on 1st August, Naples on 2nd August and Alexandria 5th, Beyrout August 6th.

As the voyage via Alexandria is longer, it should be used by members boarding the boats from Marseilles, Genoa and Naples and on the return from Istanbul only in case of necessity. As the boat stays 2 days in Alexandria however, the members choonsing this route will aso have the oppertunity of visiting Cairo.

On the return the days of departure from Istanbul are Semtember 28 and October 12 for the voyage direct to Naples, Genoa and Marseilles (with the boat "Ankara,") and September 22, 29 and October 6 for the voyage to the Orient and to Europe via Alexandria.

If a member coming to Istanbul with a ticket for the voyage back, decides to return by railway or by plane he will be repaid a third of the sum.

nl Turkey the participants will profit from a 50 percent reduction on trains as well as on boats. This reduction is valid between August 15th and October 15th. All members from abroad should apply to the nearest Wagon-Lits or Thomas Cook agencies which have been appointed as our official travelling agents and which will provide all the necessary facilities for the members.

ACCOMMODATION:

The Organizing Committee has fixed three grades of accommodation,

The first class hotels charge 8 T.L. or more per day (bedroom with bath included).

The second class hotels charge 3 to 5 T.L. per day (without bathroom).

Members preferring third class acommodation will be given rooms in colleges such as the Colleges of Galatasaray, Kabataş, Çapa and Robert College, free of charge.

A limited number of members may be the guests of Turkish families.

All the members will get a ticket-book with reduced prices for breakfast, lunch and dinner, on payment of their fees to the Registrar of the Congress. Members of the first group will have their meals at the Taksim Belediye Gazinosu or at the Park Hotel. Turkish food will be served at Misir Çarşısı Lokantası, Abdullah Efendi Lokantası or Konyalı Lokantası. Members preferring 2nd category accommodation will have their meals at the Mensa Academica (Canteen) of the Faculties of Law and Economics (where 540 persons can be served). 1.50 T.L. - 2.50 T.L. is charged per meal. Members preferring third category accommodation will have their meals at the Marmara Restaurant in Bayezit, which charges 1.25 - 1.50 T.L. per meal and has room for 150 persons.

Breakfast facilities will be the same for the second and third categories. All members are asked to indicate in which group they wish to be inscribed, to fill out the applications enclosed and to send them in not later than the middle of July 1951.

EXCURSIONS IN ANATOLIA:

(Expenses including 50 percent reduction on railways and state boats.)
There will be 3 excursions for members of the Congress:

1) For specialists of the sections Ancient Orient and Asia Minor:

of about 1000 km. will be made by bus. For a group of 25 persons the fare will
be 700.∞ T. L., so that each participant would be charged 28.00 T. L. To this must

be added the railway fare Istanbul - Ankara and return: 1st class 38.10 T. L. and 2 nd Class 27.70 T. L.

In total the fare amounts to 66 or 55 T.L. To this will be added the accommodation fares in Ankara, Yozgat and Kayseri, (2-3 T.L. per day.) The duration of the trip is 7 days.

2) For specialists of the Islamic Studies and of Turkish History:

4) If there is a sufficient number of interested scholars (groups of four), a journey to the excavations of Karatepe (Cilicia) can be organized. This journey (route: Istanbul - Adana - Antakya - Ceyhan - Kadirli - Karatepe - Ceyhan - Adana - Istanbul) will last seven days. (Approximately 300 T. L. per person)

EXHIBITIONS AND PERFORMANCES:

The following exhibitions and performances will be organized for the members of the Congress:

From the hundreds of thousands of books stored in the public and private libraries of İstanbul, Ankara, Kayseri, Niğde, Konya, Afyonkarahisar, Manisa and Bursa, rare works and works of art will be selected and exhibited; special committees of experts are already busy at this task. In Istanbul an art exhibition will be organized showing the old Turkish art traditions reflected in the Turkish painting and cartons of to-day, the process of evolution of old Turkish music and the phases of development of Turkish decorative art. In connection with the latter, the old musical instruments, notes and manuscript copies for the history of music, figures of the old and new Karagöz will be shown. There will be performances of Turkish national music, of "Karagöz", and "Orta oyunu".

In another exhibition rare coins, of special interest to numismatists, and valuable historical documents from the Turkish State Archives and Evkaf will be shown.

In the buildings of the University where the Congress will take place a book-exhibition will be organized to which western and eastern publishers as well as the Turkish Ministry of Education, the Universities, the Turkish Historical and Linguistic Societies and other institutions will contribute their publications. A group of Istanbul booksellers will exhibit old Turkish works published in Arabic characters.

In Ankara the Ethnographical Museum will organize an exhibition of works concerning Turkish ethnography, folklore and folkloristic performances of different regions in Anatolia.
