ment of earlier cosmopolitan
church drama, which first
appears in the 14th cent. attaining

its greatest grandeur in the 15th
but continuing with only gradually
abating splendor until close of
Reign of Elizabeth.

First showed itself in 14th Cent.

Corpus christi Day to be
celebrated by edict of Pope Clement V
1311. Transubstantiation

Thurs. after Trinity Sunday.
early sun. 2. mos after Easter
10 days after Whitsuntide.

This became pop. time for circle
mystery plays.


