

John Scott Everton has been elected president of Robert College of Istanbul according to an announcement by Grinnell Morris, Chairman of the Trustees. Mr. Everton comes to his new post from Education and World Affairs where he is vice-president and the executive director of EWA's division, the Overseas Educational Service, which is a service designed primarily for American academic personnel interested in teaching and administrative assignments in universities and colleges of underdeveloped countries. EWA's purpose is to assist in strengthening the performance of American higher educational institutions in world affairs in teaching, research, exchange of persons and cooperation with educational institutions abroad.

A former U.S. ambassador to Burma, Mr. Everton was born in Rochester, New York. He graduated from the University of Redlands in California and earned his Ph.D at Yale University in 1938. Mr. Everton taught philosophy at Grinnell College in Iowa, where he became chairman of the division of social studies. In 1949, Mr. Everton became president of Kalamazoo College in Michigan, where he served until 1953 when the Ford Foundation appointed him its representative in Burma. He returned to New York in 1957, as executive associate of the Ford Foundation's International Training and Research program and was made associate director of that program in 1959.

President Kennedy appointed Mr. Everton ambassador to Burma in May, 1961 a post he held until June 1963. While in Burma, Mr. Everton served on the Fulbright Board, the Burma-American Institute Board and was president of the Burma-American Association. He was also lecturer and external examiner in philosophy at the University of Rangoon. He has served abroad as senior representative for the American Friends Service Committee in India and as special representative for the AFSC in Finland in 1947.
